Naked Run 'BWC' Barossa Valley Shiraz was named after the three proprietors of the company - Baraglia, Wood and Currie.

The fruit for this single vineyard wine was sourced from a low yielding vineyard in the highly regarded sub region of Greenock in the north of the Barossa Valley. The fruit was crushed and destemmed into small open fermenters. The wine undertook natural ferment, with the cap gently plunged 3 times a day. The wine was fermented for 17 days on skins then basket pressed to new and older French and American oak barriques. After 20 months of maturation, the wine was bottled in November 2011.

The 2010 BWC Shiraz is a deep crimson colour. On the nose there are notes of chocolate and spice, with a hint of raspberries. The palate is rich and full, showing powerful ripe fruit flavours with silky tannins that will only soften out with age, finish this off with hints of charry, spicy oak. Great
